Introduction

We're delighted to welcome you to the 50th edition of Kilkenny Arts Festival. From classical music to contemporary dance, visual art to immersive theatre, this edition of our Festival is designed to thrill, delight and inspire.

Our 50th Festival kicks off with a special audio-visual installation projected on the walls of Kilkenny Castle. Inspired by Damien Harrington (who designed our first logo), *In Good Hands* is a spectacular tribute to the beauty of handmade art and design. Just as spectacular is the new luminarium – a giant inflatable structure designed for kids big and small – that rises in Kilkenny Castle Parklands.

Music has been at the forefront of the Festival from its inception, and this year is no exception. We're thrilled to welcome back Irish Chamber Orchestra for two concerts in St Canice's Cathedral, including a collaboration with Radiohead's Philip Selway. Our classical programme also features Chamber Choir Ireland performing the Irish premiere of Rhona Clarke's Requiem, the return of Barry Douglas, and a collaboration with the RTÉ Concert Orchestra that sees Iarla Ó Lionáird and Ciarán Hinds perform a song cycle based on Seamus Heaney's Sweeney Astray. All this, plus lunchtime concerts from Camerata Kilkenny and the Carducci Quartet, and a late-night performance from viola da gamba virtuoso Lixsania Fernández.

Other musical highlights include Grammy Award-winner Oumou Sangaré blending Afro-pop, folk rock and blues, the Rollercoaster Sessions with its diverse array of local and international acts, and a terrific line-up for the Marble City Sessions, co-curated by Martin Hayes. Crash Ensemble return for a three-concert residency, while Dave Holland's Wicked Little Atoms in The Fragments of the Long Waves (which KAF commissioned) premieres in Cleere's. And be sure to look out for the Secret Garden Music series, free each day across special spaces in the city.

We're excited to work with two local theatre companies. Festival favourites Asylum Productions bring together actors, community groups and professional artists to present *The Local*, an immersive experience set in a pub in 1992. Barnstorm Theatre bring three new plays to benches around Kilkenny. Speaking of benches, we also welcome Tink Flaherty, accompanied by their very own bench, for a multi-sensory show in Cleere's. Since last autumn we've been working with members of migrant communities based in Kilkenny, and the incomparable John Scott of Irish Modern Dance Theatre, to create *Migration Sonata*, a rich blend of movement and song exploring our similarities and differences.

To commemorate the tenth anniversary of the death of Seamus Heaney, we present a three-part series of discussions and readings from the poet's celebrated translations. Our poet-in-residence this year is the distinguished Kwame Dawes, while acclaimed journalist Ben Judah delivers the 2023 Hubert Butler Lecture and the Hubert Butler Essay Prize is presented in the Parade Tower alongside an exciting line-up of talks.

The Butler Gallery exhibition, featuring a stellar line-up of artists, explores the relationship between art and sport, while the Festival Gallery plays host to the work of fresh new talent Deirdre Frost. From the castle to the cathedral, the Marble City is the place to be this August. See you there!

Light Up the Castle: In Good Hands is a spectacular audio-visual show projecting images onto the walls of Kilkenny Castle, featuring a handmade short film specially created for the Festival by Wicklow-based Fictions Picture Company and directed by Jack Phelan.

Inspired by Damien Harrington (who designed the original Festival logo in 1974), the film celebrates the graphic artists who made everything by hand before computers came along. Projected onto the walls of the castle as night falls, and featuring music from Roamer and Ensemble Ériu, *In Good Hands* is a breathtaking tribute to the beauty of handmade art and design.

Benched is a one-person show with a concept so simple it's almost revolutionary. Tink takes a bench to a public location and invites strangers to sit with them, sharing stories and making connections. The stories that arise from these intimate, one-to-one encounters are then woven into their show.

Tink is a queer, non-binary and neurodivergent artist from the north of England, with Irish Traveller heritage. Since 2018 Benched has been performed all over the UK to great acclaim, and we're thrilled to welcome Tink to Kilkenny. Sometimes cheeky, sometimes shocking, Benched is a multi-sensory show that explores powerful themes of class, gender and neurodivergence with humour and hope.

Migration Sonata

John Scott's Irish Modern Dance Theatre is one of the most acclaimed dance companies in Ireland, celebrated for developing breathtakingly original new works in collaboration with a wide range of people, from leading Irish and international dancers to refugees and torture survivors.

Their previous shows in Kilkenny (the *Lear Project* in 2014, and *Interventions* in 2018), featuring legendary New York dancer Valda Setterfield, were must-see events.

For this new piece, *Migration Sonata*, which has been workshopped in a national ins Kilkenny since October 2022, Scott brings together members of the migrant Tanz Magazine community in Kilkenny, creating a profound and moving exploration of our similarities and differences through a rich blend of movement and song.

Philip Selway may be best known as the drummer in Radiohead but, like his bandmates, he has spread his wings in recent years. A multitalented composer, singer and performer, he's scored soundtracks for film and dance projects and released a string of well-received albums that blend everything from contemporary classical music to electronica.

His latest album, Strange Dance, is a collection of intimate songs wrapped around his mellow voice, and St Canice's is the perfect setting for Selway's rich orchestral soundscapes. Joined by a stellar cast of musicians including Adrian Utley, Quinta, Chris Vatalaro, Laura Moody and members of the ICO, Selway shows just why he deserves to take centre stage.

Viola da gamba virtuoso Lixsania Fernández has performed all over the world with leading orchestras and early music ensembles, including Jordi Savall's Hespérion XXI and the Orquesta Nacional de España. For this concert in St John's, Fernández explores the work of José Marín. A Spanish baroque harpist, guitarist and composer, Marín led a turbulent life marked by scandals and murder but remains famous for his tonos humanos or 'secular songs'. Concerned almost exclusively with love, sex and longing, the tonos humanos are playful, poignant, teasing and tormented, and celebrated for their enduring melodic charm.

RTÉ Concert Orchestra conducted by **David Brophy** Seamus Heaney performed at our very first Festival in 1974, and this year, to mark the 10th anniversary of his death, the RTÉ Concert Orchestra presents Sweeney, a song cycle based on his poem Sweeney Astray.

Heaney's poem is a version of the seventh-century Irish saga, Buile Shuibhne, a poem about the clash between the natural and man-made world, and the role of race, religion and family, that still speaks to us today.

Composed by Neil Martin and conducted by David Brophy, with vocals from Iarla Ó Lionáird and narration by Ciarán Hinds, Sweeney brings Heaney's words to life in a memorable tribute to one of Ireland's greatest poets.

Broadcaster John Kelly will interview Neil Martin before the show begins.

Barry Douglas



Since winning the gold medal at the 1986 Tchaikovsky International Piano Competition, Barry Douglas has enjoyed a stellar international career, performing with leading international orchestras and giving recitals across the globe. For the first time since 2014 Douglas returns to the Festival, bringing an enticing programme that features two of Schubert's 'impromptus' (freeform compositions that sound improvised), the much-praised Piano Sonata in A minor, and Liszt's Piano Sonata in B minor, dedicated to Robert Schumann.
